

PRESS RELEASE, 28th January 2015:

An Exhibition in Art, 'Seeing the New Testament for what it is', opens to the public for four days at Bishop Street Methodist Church in Leicester's City Centre on Thursday 12th February at 12.00 noon.

Artworks describe the literary forms of the New Testament books and show how carefully, and artistically, the books were crafted. 'The exhibition introduces the fruits of research which will inform and intrigue both those who know a lot about these books and those who know very little,' says Rev Dr David G Palmer, author, researcher and Architect turned artist.

Dr Palmer is known in Leicester: he was the Superintendent Methodist Minister of the Leicester Trinity Circuit from 2005-2012. He returns to launch his two-year nationwide tour which will conclude in his home town of Hull, City of Culture, 2017.
